

SOME SIXTY-EIGHT YEARS AGO, after the ending of World War II, a page appeared in Brighton Mill's company magazine, THE WARP and WEFT. It showed the photo and name of each of those soldiers of whom would "never return" from the terrible conflict that engaged some 408 members of the "Brighton Family". Notice that the "Memorium", below, is signed by Mr. J. K. Morrison. Right after the War, Morrison wasted no time in establishing an everlasting memorial to these twelve Brighton Employees. Then only some five months later, Morrison erected another monument at Model School in memory of community students-turned-soldiers, lost in "The War". These two WWII monuments were to become the "The Nation's Firsts".
